Economic Recovery: Lessons Learned

What can we do?

Identify problems and solutions.

- **Problems** like loss of inventory/property and economic injury due to the population moving
- **Solutions** like provide small grants to businesses (through philanthropy) and develop new industry (workforce training)



Economic Recovery: Lessons Learned

Lessons Learned

- **Coordination among local stakeholders PRIOR to disaster is key**
- **Strong consensus and leadership from the local community**
- **Know what you have
– before you lose it**



Economic Recovery: Lessons Learned

Lessons Learned

- **Know what is available to help**
- **Number 1 request after each disaster?**
 - **small grants to jumpstart businesses after disaster (no loans)**



Economic Recovery: Lessons Learned

Economic Recovery Support Function (RSF)

The core recovery capability for economic recovery is the ability to return economic and business activities (including food and agricultural) to a healthy state and develop new business and employment opportunities that result in a sustainable and economically viable community.



Economic Recovery: Lessons Learned

Economic Recovery Support Function (RSF)

- **Support local and tribal governments**, nonprofits and the private sector in their efforts to develop a multi-dimensional strategy capable of supporting economic recovery and enhancing community resiliency.
- Support long-term, sustainable economic recovery for communities challenged by the consequences of a disaster.
- Encourage State, Federal, local and tribal government interagency coordination, information sharing, communication and collaboration.
- Collaborate with other RSFs on cross-cutting issues.
